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#### VI. Reports/Presentations

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#### A. City and County ACO Reports - City and County Animal Control

County ACO gave their report including picking up a total of 213 animals, 191 to the ASCMV; 23 owner released dogs, one owner release cat, 106 stray dogs, 50 stray cats, one animal for care and maintenance hold, seven injured animals and three quarantines performed at the ASCMV, and held at the County Court hold facility. Return to owners included 48 with a yearly total of 843. Scanned 227 animals; 51 with microchips, 25 IDs. For every call the ACO does try to educate the public on sterilization, microchipping, etc. Responded to 785 calls for the month of November; 33 injured animal calls, nine cruelty calls, 37 vicious animals, 19 bite calls.

City ACO gave their report including responding to 525 reported strays and of those 260 were GOA (gone on arrival); 265 were impounded/apprehend, 231 were taken to ASCMV with 130 dogs and 101 were cats. Successful in field RTO 34, unsuccessful in returning 18 with a type of identification.

# B. Shelter Statistics and Activities/Educational and Spay-Neuter Initiatives

Clint Thacker gave the ASCMV Executive Director's report. Current count at the shelter 546 which is down from 2018 at 657. Intake 2019 was 761 for November; 2018 was 929; 2018 was 406 cats in 2018 and 258 in 2019. November 2019 outcomes were 265 adoptions, reclaims 104, rescue 185, community cats 53, euthanasia 255. The live release rate was 70.6%. Total surgeries 296 with only three individuals plus the veterinarian. Total visitors 2,842 in November.

#### C. Committee Reports

#### 1. Finance - David Dollahon, Committee Chair

City Finance staff gave the financial report. Cash balance is at \$360,000; receivable balance is at \$92,000; \$88,000 due from Doña Ana County and about \$36,000 is due from the City of Anthony. Payroll liabilities at \$62,000. Balance of \$10,000 in revenues collected in advance for the Best Friends Grant. Unassigned balance for the general fund is \$380,000. The capital projects fund, 7441, restricted fund balance of \$3,600 and that is for the Stern Capital Donation. Change in net activities, total revenues \$1.380 million, expenditures \$1.100 million. The change in fund balance \$202,000 and after transfer of \$78,000 from the general fund to capital fund. Budget to actual schedule. Budget parameter for November is 47.1%. Total revenues

is 48.1%, that's mainly because of Doña Ana County and City of Las Cruces contribution. Total expenditures are at 30.9%.

#### 2. Executive - Lynn Ellins, Committee Chair

Chair Ellins stated the primary item for discussion was request for review of the ASCMV Joint Powers Agreement. It appears the City is supplying more services to the ASCMV than required under the JPA so there is a resolution to revisit the JPA with respect to what responsibilities should be assigned to both the County and the City.

#### 3. Facilities - Greg Smith, Committee Chair

Board Member Smith stated they met last week with a variety of concerns to be considered; guillotine doors for the infirmary area, areas need heaters such as impound and observation areas. The washer and dryer are industrial strength and at the end of useful lives. American Linen is helping temporarily and a volunteer is willing to transport the laundry. Outdoor animal areas are being heated with patio propane heaters. Rain leak over the cat area.

ASA Architects gave an extensive presentation concerning the new building for the ASCMV via the GO bond. They had experts in Animal Service Centers and LEED certification, along with landscape. This project creates a new stray animal adoption center with administrative offices onsite. Main building with four dog pods are the total building area, along with a dog park and parking. Submit for permit April 2020 and bidding and negotiation at the same time, with construction to start December 2020 with completion summer 2021.

Board Member Smith and Dollahon suggested that the Rinconada and Bataan sides of the center be connected somehow for vehicles/pedestrians.

David Maestas, Las Cruces Public Works Director stated there will be continued public input.

#### D. Zero in 7 Update

Jean Gilbert, Secretary for the Coalition for Pets and People discussed some of the local nonprofits; Las Cruces Dog Park Coalition, Las Cruces Pet Network, NM Forever Homes Animal Rescue, Safe Haven Animal Sanctuary, SNAP, Dog is My Co-Pilot, UNcaged Paws. The Coalition recognized Board Members Smith and Eakman for their hard work with the ASCMV Board, as they relinquish their Council seats.

for December 31, 2019.

Attached are the unaudited financial results of the Animal Service Center operations for the period ending December 31, 2019. Below are some observations for your consideration:

- The Statement of Net Position (page 1) shows cash of \$281,912. There is an outstanding accounts receivable balance of \$92,311, \$88,636 is due from Dona Ana County and the \$3,675 is due from the City of Anthony in the General Fund.
- The outstanding payroll liabilities are \$62,009 in the General Fund. There is no outstanding accounts payable balance for the period. In addition, there is a \$3,775 Best Friends Grant that waives first-time impound and hold fees and assists to reduce shelter deaths for cats and dogs in Revenues Collected in Advance.
- There is an Unassigned Fund balance of \$308,439 in the General Fund.
- There is a Restricted Fund balance of \$3,565 in Fund 7441 the Capital Projects Fund remaining for the Stern Cat Room Donation that has not been expended.
- The Statement of Revenues and Expenditures (page 2) shows YTD operating revenues in the General Fund are \$1,571,483. YTD operating expenditures are at \$1,363,315, after the \$77,500 transfer to the Capital Project Fund, this result in a net increase in Fund Balance of \$130,668.
- The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance Budget to Actual (page 3) indicates 54.8% of budgeted revenues and 48.2% of budgeted expenditures have been recognized. The current budget parameter for this month is 50.0%.

- The Center held a Vaccination Clinic in the month of September at the Pan American Center that contributes to the 58.1% Vaccination revenues.
- Onsite adoptions are at 54.5% or 4.5% above the budget parameter for the month.
- Dona Ana County and the City of Las Cruces revenues are at 57.5%. This is because the JPA states that 22% of total financial contributions budgeted shall be paid on or before July  $1^{st}$  of the upcoming fiscal year by both parties.
- The City of Anthony revenues are showing 95.7%.
- Grant Revenues is at 239.7% pending board approval of the \$25,000 Best Friends Grant.
- Temporary agency services are 12.9% above the 50% threshold. The Center is in the process of becoming completely staffed.
- Insurance expenditures are at 60.0% due to payments to Berkley Insurance and New Mexico Mutual Causality that are not posted as Prepaid Insurance and allocated on a monthly basis.

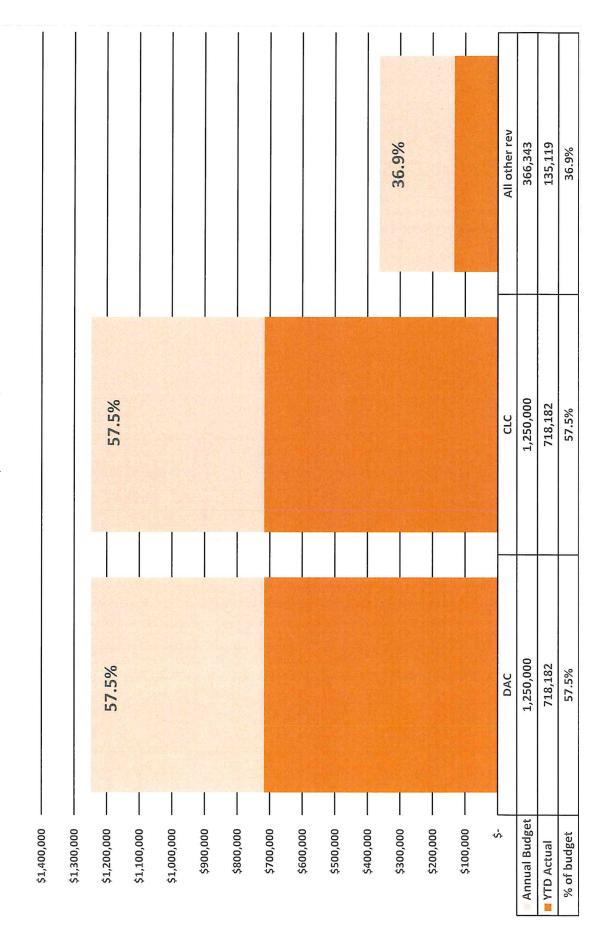

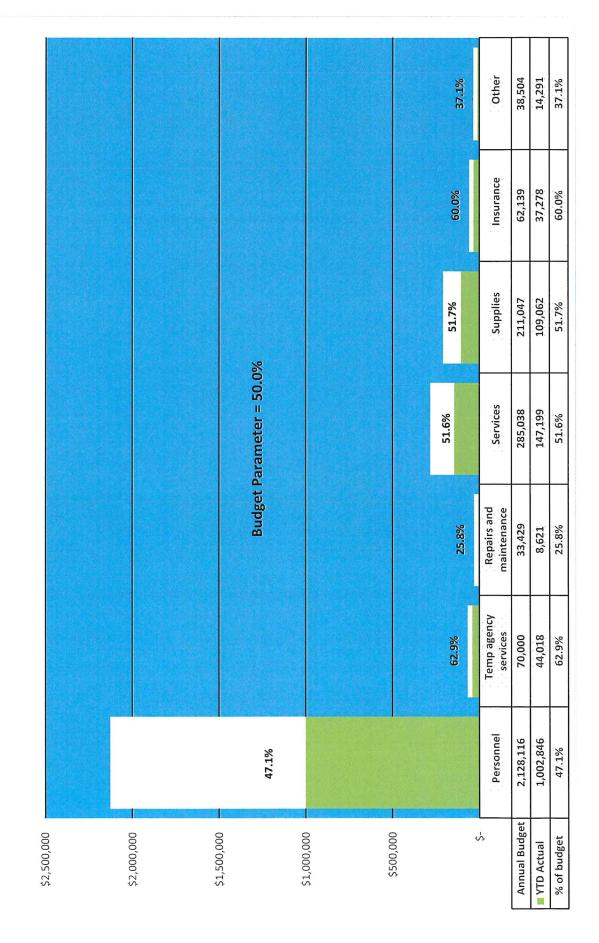

Cherished K-9 All Breed Rescue, established in 2013, is dedicated to rescuing and re-homing neglected, abused and abandoned dogs in Las Cruces, NM and surrounding communities. CK-9 rescues dogs off the streets and helps return to owners. If unable to locate the owner,

CK-9's provides care in their foster program until the animals are adopted or transported to rescues. CK-9's goal is to assist our area in decreasing the euthanasia rate at our local animal shelter by rescuing dogs BEFORE they reach the shelter.

<u>Comments</u>: CK-9's rescued over two dozen pregnant dogs from the ASCMV during 2019. CK-9's assisted Dona Ana County Animal Control trapping a pack of 9 dogs abandoned in the desert (from a group of over 20, still monitoring those with a field camera in efforts to help), including two pregnant dogs who had a combined total of 14 puppies. CK-9's was instrumental in assisting the ASCMV and private individuals, arranging transport and rescue for an additional 85 dogs (not listed in stats above) during 2019.

Recently CK-9's was called to assist with 20 dogs left on the property of a backyard breeder who died. CK-9's was able to provide services vetting the dogs and placing all in foster homes.

Currently CK-9's has 100 dogs in their foster-rescue program.
