40		В.	City and County ACO Reports - City and County Animal Control: Mary
41			Lou Ward from County ACO gave the report to include 261 reported strays
42			of which 190 were picked up; 68 cats and 122 dogs. There were nine sick
43			or injured animals; three cats and six dogs. There were 11 owner release
44			animals: all dogs. A four year comparison chart of reported strays was
45			shown. A four year comparison chart of field return to owner was shown.
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Additional animals picked up included two welfare holds and six shelter quarantines; the court hold facility is undergoing some renovations. There was six rabies submissions: all negative. A slide of the Geo Districts was shown. District 1 had eight, three cats and eight dogs; District 2 had 30; District 3 had 32; District 4 had 44; District 5 had 30; District 6 had 12; and District 7 had 34.

- A graph was shown of the stray cats picked up by District; a graph was shown of the stray dogs picked up by District. The reasons for the owner release animals included four aggressive, two dangerous, one unable to care for the animal, two sick or injured, one person moving and couldn't take the animal with them, and one said they had no time for the dog. There was discussion on the January 2021 strays; May was the highest during the year.
- 16 Officer Sal Aguirre from City ACO gave their report to include 456 stray animal calls; 196 were gone on arrival and 260 were apprehended. 211 17 were impounded at the ASCMV; 111 dogs and 100 cats. There were 41 18 successful field return with eight unsuccessful for a total of 49 identifiable 19 20 stray animals. A three year comparison chart of stray animal calls was shown. A three year comparison chart of field RTO was shown. Reasons 21 22 for owner release included one dog for aggression towards people, one dog because of old age, one dog because the owner could not have a pit bull in 23 the mobile home park, one dog for a bite, three dogs the owners were 24 25 unable to care for, one dog because it bit the owners son, two dogs where their owner could not care for them, and six dogs were aggressive. The 26 27 reasons of being unable to field RTO include seven had no contact with the owner by phone or at the residence and one where they owner was at work 28 29 and could not pick up the animal. 30
- CfPP Presentation: April Anaya who is the executive director of the Doña
 Ana County Humane Society gave the presentation. They have a board of
 directors comprised of nine community members. The history of the Doña
 Ana County Humane Society was given.
- 36 Three community programs are operated by Doña Ana County Humane Society. The biggest one is Animal Relief Fund (ARF) for families who can't 37 38 afford vet bill, determined by HUD regulations; families complete an 39 application, submit copies of proof of income, pay \$50.00 copay, and submit a photo of their pet. Families can qualify for the program once a year based 40 on date of service. The vet care voucher is good for up to \$250.00 toward 41 vet treatment costs and vaccination voucher is good for up to \$50.00 42 towards vaccination costs and doesn't require a copay. Many pets being 43 44 seen are on long term meds. There is a long term medication voucher good 45 for up to \$750.00 over a six month period.
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There was discussion of the impact of 2020 pandemic; over \$69,000.00 in assistance through the program was issued during that time alone. This year a little over \$59,000.00 has been spent in assistance. The second program is Ruff to Ready Program; partner with ASCMV and ACTion Program for Animals. The third program is Pets for Seniors; partner with ASCMV. There was discussion of funding, grants, gifts, Pets for the Elderly, individual donations, and etcetera. Their website is www.dachslc.org and they are active on Facebook.

- 10 C. Shelter Statistics/Activities: Clint Thacker gave the ASCMV Executive Director's report. The current animal count is 517; 341 dogs and 176 cats. 11 Total intake is 712; included 385 dogs and 324 cats. A slide was shown of 12 13 the animals transferred to rescues. The Helen Woodward Animal Center in 14 California took 21 dogs; there were some issues with the transport vehicle. It broke down outside of Tucson and seems to be a transmission issue. The 15 16 vehicle will be repaired but ASCMV is looking to receive a new one, working with grants and private donors. 17 18
- 19 There were two returns of dogs due to behavior issues and cats were 20 returned due to behavior problem and can't afford basic care; help and education are given to the owners prior to returning. In comparing previous 21 22 years November has been shown to be a lower live release rate; this year it's a 70.5% live release rate. Research into the reasons why will be done. 23 Community Cats had a 15.2% of the live release rate; went up considerably. 24 Euthanasia rate was 26.3%. Euthanasia reasons for dogs were mainly due 25 to respiratory issues and didn't respond to treatments and aggressive 26 behavior. Euthanasia reasons for cats were mainly due to space behavior 27 and space medical; need space in the areas to move more cats in. 28
- 30 There are currently 120 active volunteers with 457 total hours for November; volunteers are doing more around the Center as well. Total number of 31 visitors was 803. Adoption appointments kept were 95%; 174 total 32 appointments with 56% finalized adoptions. The adoption numbers do not 33 include the new walk in times on Friday and Saturday. The website page 34 35 views were 33,680; not original views but every time you look at a page. Facebook views were down to 2,257. Instagram had 226 clicks on the ad. 36 Snapchat had 455 clicks on the ad. The pets of the week are Molly the cat 37 38 and Ozzie the dog. There was discussion on feral cats and the Barrowing 39 Barn Cat Program; only 27 community cats have been euthanized compared to the hundreds that come in. 40 41
 - D. Committee Reports

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46 **Finance - Eric Enriquez, Committee Chair:** Board Member
Enriquez stated that there wasn't a Finance Committee meeting prior to this one.

Josh Saffell gave the financial report. The unaudited financial statements as of November 2021 included General Fund cash of \$1,579,275.00 and receivables of \$102,818.00 for a total assets of \$1,682,093.00. Liabilities total \$56,471.00 with revenues collected in advance of \$229,869.00; this left an unassigned fund balance of \$1,395,753.00. Change in net position for all funds included General Fund total revenues at \$1,758,787.00 and total expenditures at \$1,190,154.00.

The budget to actual change in net position is 46.3% of budgeted revenue and 31.3% of budgeted expenditures. The budget parameter is 41.6%. There was a net positive change to the fund balance of \$568,000.00. A line graph comparison of expenditures versus revenues was shown. Percentage of total expenditures included 51% salary, 15.6% benefits, 16% services, 7% supplies, 3% temporary services, 3% insurance, 2% capital, and 1% in other and repairs and maintenance.

- 2. Executive Manuel Sanchez, Committee Chair: Chair Sanchez stated they discussed Resolution 2021-09 regarding benefits and salary increases; still awaiting final numbers. Other items discussed was the JPA.
- 3. Facilities Kasandra Gandara, Committee Chair: Board Member Gandara stated they discussed a thermostat being broken, an order sent to Facilities, the HVAC not working in Mr. Thacker's office, and a computer board not working correctly. A new HVAC is needed and they are looking into warranty for the current one. Mr. Thacker stated that the thermostat was in the kennels which has been replaced, the computer board is the new unit in the office which is making it sweltering. The new computer board was put in but it still isn't working; may be a compressor issue which would cost over \$1,000.00.

Other items discussed were the scrubbers which are routinely replaced and UV bulbs are ordered, special lights. There was concern drains were plugged up; it wasn't the case. There was discussion of distemper, issue statewide. The new construction has been going well; one wall set fell but are back up and secure today. The staff is focusing on education; specifically distemper at the next staff meeting. There was discussion on the construction issue; the wall fell due to only two or three beams holding it up and it's currently a free standing wall. The issues were addressed in the GO Bond meeting.

VII. ACTION ITEM

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A. Resolution 2021-09: Wage Increase for ASCMV Personnel: Chair Sanchez stated that they still do not have all the numbers they need to consider the resolution. It is uncertain the correct information will be ready by the next meeting; needs to be prioritized to make sure it doesn't fall through the cracks. HR is on board; Mr. Thacker has deferred his increase until the staff receives theirs. Next step is to receive additional information on the 80/20 split. There was discussion on what other information is needed. There was discussion on City insurance and minimum wage changes. There was discussion on using salary savings and what they're for. There was discussion of how the ASCMV will continue being able to afford the pay increases. There was discussion of when they could have the information needed.

Motion to table to January 27, 2022 meeting by Board Member Flores, second by Board Member Abeyta-Stuve. Motion passed.

B. Resolution 2021-10: Reasonable Notice of Meetings for 2022: Mr. Thacker stated that the meetings will be moved to the fourth Thursday of the month at 9:00 a.m.; emergency meetings, special meetings, and closed meetings have not changed.

Motion by Board Member Abeyta-Stuve, second by Board Member Flores. Motion passed.

- C. Resolution 2021-11: Adoption of ASCMV 2022 Holiday/Closure Calendar: Mr. Thacker stated that the holiday closures for ASCMV now mirror government with a few exceptions; Easter is added as well as floating holidays where the Center is open. The date should state 2022.
- Motion for amendment by Board Member Flores, second by Board Member

- VIII. PUBLIC INPUT: Frank Bryce commented on receiving calls from people
 relinquishing dogs; need a resolution on the issue. He suggested the ASCMV
 takes the lead and then come to the rescues. He would like a status report on
 what's going on the incident with the child and the dogs.
- IX. CHAIR AND BOARD COMMENTS: Last Wednesday there was a meeting with
 the HR director to discuss how to improve the hiring process; a game plan was
 created to allow the ASCMV do their hiring. Chair Sanchez reminded the public

Subject: Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley Unaudited Financial Report for December 31, 2021.

Attached are the unaudited financial results of the Animal Service Center operations for the period ended December 31, 2021. Some observations for your consideration:

• The Statement of Net Position (page 1) reported cash of \$1,591,354 in the General Fund. Total assets were \$1,694,172. Accrued payroll liabilities ended at \$56,664. Total liabilities were \$253,672. The unassigned fund balance was \$1,440,500.

• The Capital Projects Fund reported restricted fund balance of \$29,798. \$28,000 is due to a transfer from the General Fund in fiscal year 2020; \$1,798 was the balance remaining for the Stern Cat Room Donation

• The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance – Budget and Actual (page 2) showed YTD operating revenues in the General Fund at \$2,052,564 which is 54.0% of budget. YTD operating expenditures were \$1,439,184 which is 37.9% of budget. The operating income for the period is \$613,380.

• All expenditures were below the budget parameter of 50.0% except Insurance which is at 78.0% due to prepayment of premiums, Temp Agency Services which is at 76.2% due to increased staffing needs.

• The Grants and Donations Schedule, page 8, provides a summary of grants and donations received.
