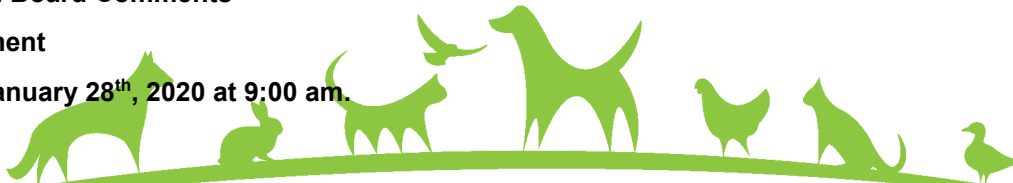

17 **I. Call to Order & Determination of Quorum (3:03 p.m.):** Chair Flores called the
18 meeting to order. A quorum was determined.

19
20 **II. Changes to Agenda and Approval of Agenda:** Mr. Thacker mentioned that the
21 City ACO's do not have a person to do the presentation, but there is a presentation.
22 Chair Flores stated they will look at the presentation. Motion by Board Member
23 Sanchez, second by Board Member Abeyta-Stuve. Motion passed.

24
25 **III. Reading of Closed Meeting Statement of October 22, 2020:** Chair Flores read
26 "The Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley Board of Directors met in closed
27 session on October 22, 2020 and only discussed those limited items as stated in
28 the posted notice. The purpose of the notice was to discuss the annual
29 performance reviews of the director of the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla
30 Valley, (which is closed pursuant to Section 10-15-1-H(2), NMSA 1978). Present,
31 Chair Flores, Board Member Sanchez, Board Member Gandara, Board Member
32 Abeyta-Stuve, Board Member Ellins, Ex-Officio Board Member Quintero, Ex-
33 Officio Board Member Dollahon. Staff in attendance, Executive Director Clint
34 Thacker until 11:15 a.m. Meeting began 10:55 a.m., adjourned 11:51 a.m.

36 **IV. Minutes**

37
38 **A. Approval of the Minutes from the regular ASCMV Board Meeting held**
39 **October 22, 2020:** Chair Flores had changes, page 7, line 27 change "one"
40 to "once." Page 8, line 9 "GEO Bonds" should be "GO Bonds." Motion by
41 Board Member Sanchez to approve the minutes as amended, second by
42 Board Member Abeyta-Stuve. Motion passed.

43
44 **V. Reports/Presentations**

1 **A. City and County ACO Reports - City and County Animal Control:** Mr.
2 Thacker presented for the City ACO. 453 reported stray animals for
3 October 2020, 237 gone on arrivals, 216 stray apprehended, 181 strays
4 impounded with 89 dogs and 92 cats, 35 successful field returns, and 10
5 unsuccessful attempted field returns that were ultimately impounded at the
6 ASCMV, total of 45 identifiable stray animals. Comparison of reported
7 strays, this year is under. Graph of three year field return to owner.
8 Reasons unable to field RTO, four had no contact by phone and/or
9 residence, four chip not registered, two chip not updated. Reasons for
10 owner release of animals, three dogs acting aggressive toward other pets,
11 and one dog acting aggressive toward the owner. The stray map was
12 shown. Board Member Gandara asked why there was not a representative
13 from the City ACO. Mr. Thacker stated he was noticed by Gino Jimenez
14 three days ago that he could not attend. Board Member Gandara persistent
15 in asked if there were other supervisors of the ACO to discuss this with.
16 Barbara DeLeon stated she will acquire an appropriate response.

17
18 Mary Lou Ward presented for the County ACO. Dispatch calls were 531,
19 officers initiated 104 calls, and responded to 24 assisted with other officers
20 or other agencies. Stray animals for October was 250, picked up 76 stray
21 cats, 89 stray dogs, for a total of 165 stray animals. There were no owner
22 surrender cats, 12 owner surrender dogs, 25 sick or injured animals picked
23 up, two animals for welfare hold, five animals to the shelter for quarantine.
24 Field return to owner three year comparison chart. October there were 34
25 animals returned to owner in the field, and year to date of 328 animals. She
26 shared the stray animals picked up by districts, but it is Sheriff districts so
27 they overlap with the Commission districts. Commissioner Ellins 22 cats,
28 22 dogs; Commissioner Gonzalez 19 cats, 41 dogs; Commissioner
29 Reynolds 22 cats, 22 dogs; Commissioner Solis 13 cats, 4 dogs;
30 Commissioner Sanchez 22 cats, 22 dogs. District 1 which is 7 cats, 1 dog;
31 District 2 which is 15 cats, 21 dogs; District 3 which is 13 cats, 4 dogs;
32 District 4 which is 22 cats, 22 dogs; District 5 which is 17 cats, 26 dogs;
33 District 6 which is 3 dogs; District 7 which is 2 cats and 12 dogs. There
34 were 10 bite calls to humans, one exposure to other animals, one rabies
35 submission that was negative, animals current on rabies vaccination were
36 three. Four animals were quarantined at the Animal Services Center, one
37 at the court hold facility, three from animals housed from a prior case at the
38 court hold facility, four animals quarantined from a home quarantine and
39 one animal was gone on arrival. Dogs that were owner released, seven
40 were aggressive, three they could no longer care for the animals and could
41 not handle the dogs, one with exigent circumstances - dog owner
42 investigated for animal cruelty and owner released, one was for financial
43 reasons. Court cases were five for October, with five charges, at about 17
44 hours of regular time and 11.6 hours of overtime. One 90-day deferred
45 sentence, two continued cases, one guilty plea, one arraignment set for a
46 motion hearing for a bench warrant. Added on the court cases were two

1 citations issued for animal cruelty, and three issued for restraint
2 requirements. SNAP report, spay/neuter dogs 36, cats 37, 41 microchips,
3 36 vaccinations; contract year to date 74 dogs spay/neuter, 55 cats, 92
4 microchips, 84 rabies vaccinations.
5

6 **B. CfPP Report:** Jean Gilbert discussed the nonprofit organizations. Working
7 with Cat's Meow and HSSNM fundraisers. They attended a meeting with
8 ASCMV on Nov. 6 that was productive. I'm Almost Home Animal Rescue
9 based in El Paso serving El Paso and Las Cruces. Diane Avery is the
10 director. Helped with dog Crackers who had a fractured leg. Dog Park
11 currently closed, but located at 430 N. Hermosa. City does a power wash
12 regularly and dog park members maintain the park on a monthly basis. Las
13 Cruces Pet Network, Randy Meyer runs. Wyatt blind dog relinquished to
14 the shelter due to owner extenuating circumstances. Pet network secured
15 a foster for Wyatt. Forever Homes Animal Rescue based in Alamogordo,
16 assists animals in southern New Mexico, El Paso, and Juarez. Jane Jones
17 is the Las Cruces representative. They have helped shelter heartworm
18 positive dogs. Two dogs, Elvira and Petunia were pulled from the Shelter
19 for foster. Forever Home Animal Rescue transported 49 Shelter dogs
20 January - October 2020 throughout New Mexico, Colorado, and other
21 states. Safe Haven, Phil received a complimentary grooming service with
22 customer rewards program. SHAS adopted 15 animals January - October
23 and planning virtual auction this month as their fundraiser to help support
24 staff salaries and three-acre sanctuary on the East Mesa that houses up to
25 45 dogs and 35 cats. SNAP with Amy Jo Gonzales who organized a virtual
26 concert fundraiser with a third of the proceeds going to SNAP. Vouchers
27 issued by SNAP January - November stand at 1,027. Barkhouse, pictured
28 Denise Beyer helped load dogs on the moms and puppies flight out of Las
29 Cruces with Pet Rescue Pilots flying animals to San Diego. Koko Dean,
30 managing director of Barkhouse featured on the cover of the Las Cruces
31 Bulletin, October 23. October 17th flight with Pet Rescue Pilots with mostly
32 cats that time. Barkhouse and Action Program for Animals sponsored the
33 flight. Julian Javor is the pilot. Sparky the dog marked the 1,000th
34 passenger, he was adopted four days later. Barkhouse has 40 dogs pulled
35 from the Animal Services Center and they will be on flights this month or
36 next month. The services of Barkhouse are snip (spay/neuter), chip
37 (microchipping), and ship. November is adopt a senior month. Most
38 organizations are offering discounted adoption fees in observation of adopt
39 a senior month. Board Member Quintero there are three airlifts scheduled
40 for Barkhouse in November, but the airplane had both engine problems and
41 wing problems so things are put off for now. The county court hold has 54
42 dogs the county is holding for the flights, including 12 puppies, just born in
43 the last two weeks. Housing these animals to help alleviate the shelter and
44 holding for transport. Kelly Barker is looking at chartering another airline,
45 reach outs to airports, and some response and hope to resume operations
46 as soon as possible.

1
2 **C. Shelter Statistics/Activities:** Clint Thacker gave the ASCMV Executive
3 Director's report. Current count at the Shelter is 374, and in 2019 there
4 were 627. Intake is continuing to increase, in 2019 it was 896, and now at
5 552 for 2020 which is 281 dogs, 245 cats, with 26 other. Returns, 6 dogs,
6 2 cats. Reasons were 5 dogs behavior problems, 1 dog landlord did not
7 allow, 1 cat animal has health issues, 1 cat can't afford basic care. Mr.
8 Thacker discussed further behavior issues and how those are discussed
9 with the adopter. Adoptions 2019 were 242 and 2020 were 222 which is
10 40%. Reclaim percentage remained the same 11% for 2019 and 2020.
11 Rescued 28.6%. Community cats 80 at 14.5%. Euthanasia at 21% so less
12 animals. With a live release rate in 2020 of 81.9%. Euthanasia reasons,
13 top is feral cats, City has no registered colonies so that is the number one
14 reason. Next is wildlife nuisance. The remaining reasons for euthanasia
15 are very low numbers. There were 38 animals euthanized for sick/injured
16 reasons. Without those 38 there would have been an 87% live release rate.
17 Chair Flores questioned the inclusion of sick/injured in the statistics. Mr.
18 Thacker stated that is why the industry level is set at 90% to be considered
19 a no-kill Shelter. Total visitors in the Shelter for October was 661, this is
20 currently only by appointments. Total website page reviews, 45,030.
21 Facebook page views of 2,285.

22
23 There were conversations at the Shelter with a synopsis sent to the Board.
24 Conversations about COVID and best practices of COVID and employees
25 for COVID. Concern from the attendees about the number of staff to help
26 care for the animals. He assured all that no animals were fed or cleaned.

27
28 The Shelter did have their audit. The exit audit interview and that went very
29 well. No findings for the ASCMV. There was a finding of last year that by
30 law they had to look at and make sure it was correct. Shelter passed with
31 flying colors, no issues or problems. Progress is being made and following
32 City regulations and steps. Ms. DeLeon reiterated that the audit is still
33 confidential until finalized.

34
35 **D. Committee Reports**

36
37 **1. Finance - Tessa Abeyta-Stuve, Committee Chair:** Board Member
38 Sanchez stated they met Tuesday with a light meeting. All looks good
39 for finances. Josh Saffell gave the unaudited financials for month
40 ending October 31, 2020. Statement of Net Position, General Fund
41 had cash \$673,719.00, receivables \$182,128.00, total assets of
42 \$855,847.00. Liabilities of \$64,497.00, revenues collected in advance
43 \$55,501.00, leaving unassigned fund balance in General Fund of
44 \$735,849.00. Capital Projects fund, \$29,798.00 in cash and matching
45 amount as a restricted fund balance also of \$29,798.00. Capital

1 Assets, net of accumulated depreciation of \$209,912.00, and a fund
2 balance of the same amount that is unassigned.

3
4 Change in net position for all funds, General Fund had total revenues
5 of \$1,339,172.00, total expenditures of \$775,071.00. The overall
6 positive net change to fund balance for the period was \$564,101.00.
7 In the Capital Projects fund there was no revenue but there was
8 expenditure for the period of \$1,767.00. Capital Assets as well, no
9 revenue but there was depreciation recognized of \$14,077.00.

10
11 Budget to Actual Change in Net Position, total revenues of
12 \$1,339,172.00 is 39.3% of the budget. Total expenditures were
13 23.0%. The budget parameter is actually 33%. (TECHNICAL
14 ISSUES WITH JOSH)

15
16 Commissioner Sanchez stated that the Shelter was slightly above the
17 33.3% parameter four months into this fiscal year, which is personnel.
18 Looking at things with Mr. Thacker, doing the split shifts there was
19 some additional overtime. And going to look deeper into the way
20 some of the costs were classified in some of the different buckets.
21 Mr. Thacker stated the budget is looking really good and they are at
22 43% and it is supposed to be 33%. Working with Mike they were able
23 to identify some discrepancies in where some personnel outside of
24 the four budgets so need to align everything. They are working with
25 HR to get things figured out.

26
27 Josie Medina finished the report. Total revenue \$1.3 million and total
28 expenditures \$775,000.00. For October, the budget parameter is
29 33.67%. Total revenues are at 39.3% which is above the budget
30 parameter and total expenditures are below the budget parameter at
31 23%. Revenues and expenditures, October total expenses were
32 \$278,000.00 and total revenues were \$192,000.00. For revenues for
33 the first month of the fiscal year you will always see that one high as
34 that is when the City and the county's contribution is 21% and the rest
35 will even out. For the expenses for October it was \$278,000.00.
36 Expenditures are made up of 79% personnel, services at 12%,
37 supplied 5%, insurance 3%, other 1%.

38
39 **2. Executive – Yvonne Flores, Committee Chair:** No report.

40
41 **3. Facilities - Kasandra Gandara, Committee Chair:** Mr. Thacker
42 stated they did not meet as the facility was not open.

43
44 **VI. PUBLIC INPUT:** Mr. Thacker received an e-mail this morning from Grace Ventura.
45 "I'm following up on the question I had in the last Zoom session pertaining to the
46 new feature on the ASCMV website. The report is posted but the contact info was

1 not on the report. I had to post one yesterday in the lost and found because the
2 found dog has not been reported elsewhere. Sorry but I added on the post to call
3 the shelter for the contact info." Mr. Thacker stated on their website people can fill
4 out a form for a found animal and then the green boxes are shown on the website.
5 At the bottom of the green box there is a "Click Here for More Information" and that
6 is not including a contact phone number. There is a discussion going on with
7 Wilson Binkley and they are looking into it.
8

9 Ms. Ventura continued "Please provide status of the \$10,000.00 Maddies Fund
10 Grant earmarked for foster animals. I think the last update was August 2020 Board
11 meeting wherein you stated there is only vet who responded. Hope all is well with
12 you, your family, and the shelter employees." Mr. Thacker showed a copy of the
13 application grant they had with a note "In response to the COVID-19 outbreak,
14 Maddies Fund is offering emergency grants to support foster care programs for the
15 next three months, apply for help to maintain your foster care." Mr. Thacker said
16 they can use it to maintain the foster care program, create an emergency foster
17 care, grant can be used for food, supplies, medical, staffing, etc. ASCMV was
18 awarded \$10,000.00. The money for that fund has all been spent as it went into
19 the medical department. The veterinarians, we had reached out to them to do
20 some of the surgeries for the ASCMV for sterilization and one said yes and then
21 another one said yes. There are now two in the area.
22

23 **VII. CHAIR AND BOARD COMMENTS:** Board Member Ellins stated he understands
24 why we are exporting dogs to other states but why are we evacuating cats to other
25 states. Mr. Thacker states if the rescue wants them we give them. Board Member
26 Ellins finds it unbelievable there is a shortage of cats anywhere. Board Member
27 Quintero stated the places the animals are being shipped to are Oregon,
28 Washington, Idaho, and some parts of California who state laws clearly that all
29 animals must be sterilized, so as a result their populations and adoptable animals
30 are very few.
31

32 Jean Gilbert stated they have the resources that they can mandate spay and
33 neuter. We do not have those resources.
34

35 **VIII. Adjournment (4:20 p.m.)** Board Member Ellins motioned to adjourn and Board
36 Member Sanchez seconded.

Subject: Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley Unaudited Financial Report for November 30, 2020.

Attached are the unaudited financial results of the Animal Service Center operations for the period ended November 30, 2020. Some observations for your consideration:

- The Statement of Net Position (page 1) reported cash of \$864,983 in the General Fund. Total assets were \$869,838. Accrued payroll liabilities ended at \$87,614. Total liabilities were \$143,115. The unassigned fund balance was \$726,723.
- The Capital Projects Fund reported restricted fund balance of \$29,798. \$28,000 is due to a transfer from the General Fund in fiscal year 2020; \$1,798 was the balance remaining for the Stern Cat Room Donation
- The Statement of Revenues and Expenditures (page 2) showed YTD operating revenues in the General Fund at \$1,598,733. YTD operating expenditures were \$1,043,758 with an operating income of \$554,975.
- The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance – Budget to Actual (page 3) indicated 46.9% of budgeted revenues and 30.6% of budgeted expenditures had been recognized. The budget parameter for November was 41.67%.
- Insurance expense was at 49.7% of budget due to premiums being paid at the beginning of the fiscal year. All other expenditures, schedule pages 4 to 7, were below the budget parameter of 41.67%.
- The Grants and Donations Schedule, page 9, provides a summary of grants and donations received.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-20**

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR DETERMINATION OF REASONABLE NOTICE OF MEETINGS AND MEETING DATE OF THE ANIMAL SERVICE CENTER OF THE MESILLA VALLEY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1(B) of the Open Meetings Act (NMSA 1978, Sections 10-15-1 to -4) states that, except as may be otherwise provided in the Constitution or the provisions of the Open Meetings Act, all meetings of a quorum of members of any board, council, commission, administrative adjudicatory body or other policymaking body of any state or local public agency held for the purpose of formulating public policy, discussing public business or for the purpose of taking any action within the authority of or the delegated authority of such body, are declared to be public meetings open to the public at all times; and

WHEREAS, any meetings subject to the Open Meetings Act at which the discussion or adoption of any proposed resolution, rule, regulation or formal action occurs shall be held only after reasonable notice to the public; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 21 amended the Open Meetings Act (OMA) to increase the time that public bodies must make the final agenda available from at least 24 hours prior to a meeting to at least 72 hours, except in the case of an emergency; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1 (D) of the open Meetings Act requires the Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley to determine annually what constitutes reasonable notice of its public meetings;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley that:

1. All meetings shall be held at the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 700 N. Main St., Las Cruces, New Mexico at 9:00 a.m. or as indicated in the meeting notice.
2. Unless otherwise specified, regular meetings shall be held each month on the fourth Thursday of the month. The agenda will be available at least seventy-two hours prior to the meeting. The notice shall indicate how a copy of the agenda may be obtained.
3. Special meetings may be called by the chairman or a majority of the members upon three days notice. The notice shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how members of the public may obtain a copy of the agenda. The agenda shall be available to the public at least twenty-four hours before any special meeting.
4. Emergency meetings will be called only under unforeseen circumstances that demand immediate action to protect the health, safety and property of citizens or to protect the public body from substantial financial loss. The Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley will avoid emergency meetings whenever possible. Emergency meetings may be called by the Chairman or a majority of the members upon twenty-four hours notice, unless threat of personal injury or property damage requires less notice. The notice for all emergency meetings shall include an agenda for the meeting or information on how the public may obtain a copy of the agenda.
5. For the purposes of regular meetings described in paragraph 2 of this resolution, notice requirements are met if notice of the date, time, place and agenda is posted in the following locations: Branigan Library, City of Las Cruces Clerks Office, and the Doña Ana County Clerks Office.
6. For the purposes of special meetings and emergency meetings described in paragraphs 3 and 4 of this resolution, notice requirements are met if notice of the date, time, place and agenda is posted in the following locations: Branigan Library, City of Las Cruces Clerks Office, and the Doña Ana County Clerks Office.
7. In addition to the information specified above, all notices shall include the following language:

If You Need an Accommodation for a Disability to Enable You to Fully Participate in the Event Please Contact Us 48 Hours Before the Event at 382-0018/v or 541-2128/tty.

8. The Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley may close a meeting to the public only if the subject matter of such discussion or action is excepted from the open meeting requirement under Section 10-15-1(H) of the Open Meetings Act:

(a) If any meeting is closed during an open meeting, such closure shall be approved by a majority vote of a quorum of the Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley taken during the open meeting. The authority for the closed meeting and the subjects to be discussed shall be stated with reasonable specificity in the motion to close and the vote of each individual member on the motion to close shall be recorded in the minutes. Only those subjects specified in the motion may be discussed in the closed meeting.

(b) If a closed meeting is conducted when the Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley is not in an open meeting, the closed meeting shall not be held until public notice, appropriate under the circumstances, stating the specific provision of law authorizing the closed meeting and the subjects to be discussed with reasonable specificity, is given to the members and to the general public.

(c) Following completion of any closed meeting, the minutes of the open meeting that was closed, or the minutes of the next open meeting if the closed meeting was separately scheduled, shall state whether the matters discussed in the closed meeting were limited only to those specified in the motion or notice for closure.

(d) Except as provided in Section 10-15-1(H) of the Open Meetings Act, any action taken as a result of discussions in a closed meeting shall be made by vote of the Board of Directors of the Animal Service Center of the Mesilla Valley in an open public meeting.
